- Final year project with dissertation is mandatory for post graduate students
- For UG entry level students, Communication Skill is imparted through the English Language Laboratory equipped with LCD Projectors, Computers and interactive CDs.
- One skill based paper is implemented with 100% ICT.
- Students and Teachers access e-books and e-journals via DELNET and INFLIBNET.
- Dr. M.S.K. Mohaideen, Psychologists, Life Clinic Foundation, Coimbatore visits every month to our college and give counselling to all the students to mould their character and enhancing their academic skills. Psychological counselling is given to some of the problematic and needy students. Some students visit him personally under the advice of HODs.
- Dr. Kalimuthu M.B.B.S visits our college on every Wednesday. Students easily get the doctor's advice and treatment at free of cost.
- Students select their NME courses and Diploma courses through on-line.
- Students submit their assignments to the course teacher through on-line.
- Provisions have been made in the time table for the students seminar hour.
- 3-hour test on Saturdays and Peer teaching classes are conducted for failed students, by senior students in Physics Department.
- Virudhunagar District Cluster of Colleges Joint Faculty Programmes is being implemented in Maths, Physics, Chemistry, English, Computer Science, Zoology, and History Subjects. After signing in the MOU by the respective Principals, there are eleven member colleges in the cluster. Each college has to arrange one programme on behalf of the Department in an academic year for the benefit of students in the form of a guest lecture / competition in subject matters / quiz / workshop etc. Department of Physics coordinates the cluster college meetings in Physics for the past three years.
- Dionysus, an Intra-collegiate cultural fest, was conducted by the Department of English and literary forum was started to enrich their English knowledge.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

Extension Activities:

1. Free Siddha Medical Camp was organised by Department of Physics at Pavadithoppu area, Aruppukottai on 24-01-2016. 300 patients were treated by a team of 4 siddha doctors and were distributed medicines worth of Rs.50,000/-.
2. A demo was conducted by the students in the Madathupatti School on preparation of washing powder, cleaning powder, soap oil, computer incense sambirani and candle.
3. Chemistry experiments demonstration was made for Madathupatti School students.
4. Free Medical Camp was arranged for teachers and students on 27-10-2015.
5. Deworming Camp organized by YRC on 10-02-2016.
6. Urinary stone detection camp on 17-12-2015 at Sottamuri village where more number of kidney failure cases were reported.
7. NCC cadets are involved in the Plantation of tree saplings, crowd control during temple functions, Anti – Tobacco awareness rally, Swachh Bharath Mission programme, cleaning work at temples and hospitals etc.
8. NSS Students perform awareness programme on Dengue fever and Rain water harvesting.
9. Students of Economics Department have planted 100 tree saplings in the Kattangudi village.
10. YRC volunteers frequently visit old age home and orphanage, blind school, conducting National Deworming Day, Food Safety awareness programme, They also render their valuable service to the oppressed people.
11. NSS, NCC, and YRC Programme officers conduct Blood donation camps very often in association with Government Hospitals. This benefits the economically weaker section of the people.

12. Department of History has arranged a Heritage trip to visit the Jain cave temple at Othakadai, Arittapatty, Keelakuilkudi and visited Thirumayam, Thirupathur, Chittannavasal and Tanjore. Historical exhibition was conducted on 24-03-2016 in the college premises.
13. Thendral Nagar People Welfare Association, Aruppukottai, presented a Memento - cup as a token of recognition of 25 years of service rendered to Thendral Nagar by the Physics Department Students and Faculty members in a meeting organized at Azeez Nagar on 07-04-2016.
14. Students of Physics department are engaging free coaching classes for 10th, 12th and elementary class children of Municipal Labourers in the municipal colony, Ramasampuram, Aruppukottai. They are also conducting free coaching classes for the Middle School girl students belonging to CSI Boarding School, Aruppukottai.
15. Department of chemistry organized a soil testing camp at Madathupatty- the adopted village of the department, on 5.08.2015. Nearly one hundred and twenty farmers of the village benefited by the way of testing their soil and water samples.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The Syllabus for all departments is reviewed and new regulation is implemented once in three years.
- The syllabus of new regulation is framed by considering the syllabus of neighbouring Universities, autonomous colleges and based on the local needs.
- In addition, introduction / deletion of any new course paper are also permitted if it is warranted.
- All faculty members are involved in framing the syllabi and participate in the Board of Studies Meeting. All suggestions, revision / incorporation of new titles and papers are seriously taken into consideration in drafting the final syllabi.
- Consideration is given to the feedback of course teachers and students.
- Feedback from the subject experts, University nominees, Alumni and students are taken into consideration.
- Syllabus ratification is obtained through Academic Council which will be held every year.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Four new LCD projector units have been installed in four departments.
- Use of ICT, on-line materials.
- The academic year calendar is issued to all in time which helps the stake holders to plan their academic activity.
- Conducting unit tests, quizzes, assignments, group discussion classes, seminars by students etc.
- Students are encouraged to submit their assignment through on-line.
- Motivating students for research activities through Conference / Workshop / Seminar / Guest Lecture etc.
- Teacher's study materials [Soft copy-PPT slides/PDF presentation] and lecture notes are shared with students.
- By involving all first year students to attend computer literacy and communication skill classes through empowerment programme.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- All components in any programme of study are evaluated continuously through internal evaluation and an external evaluation. Internal evaluation is done throughout the semester/year in the form of three CIA examinations, quizzes and assignments. External evaluation is done at the end of semester / year in the form of summative examination.
- The summative examination question papers are set by the external experts from other colleges or Universities. They prepare the scheme of evaluation, giving guidelines for the examiners for distribution of marks in the question. In case of numerical problems, solution of the problems with distribution of marks for different stages should be given in scheme of marking.
- Evaluation of answer scripts will be done by the course teacher and external examiner from other colleges and universities. Feedback on question paper will be collected from subject experts to improve the quality of questions in future.
- Publishing the examination results on the internet through the college website.
- Students are also permitted to apply for revaluation after the publication of results with in a stipulated period.
- After revaluation, records are updated with changes if any and the student will be issued a revised memorandum of marks. If there are no changes, the student shall be intimated the same through a letter or a notice.
- Based on the credits and marks obtained by the student, the Grade Point Average (GPA) will be calculated for semester/year and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be calculated for entire program. Award of class will be finalized based on CGPA.
- Before the publication of summative examination results, the performance of the students is analyzed in the Awards Committee Meeting consisting of two University Nominees.

6.3.4 Research and Development

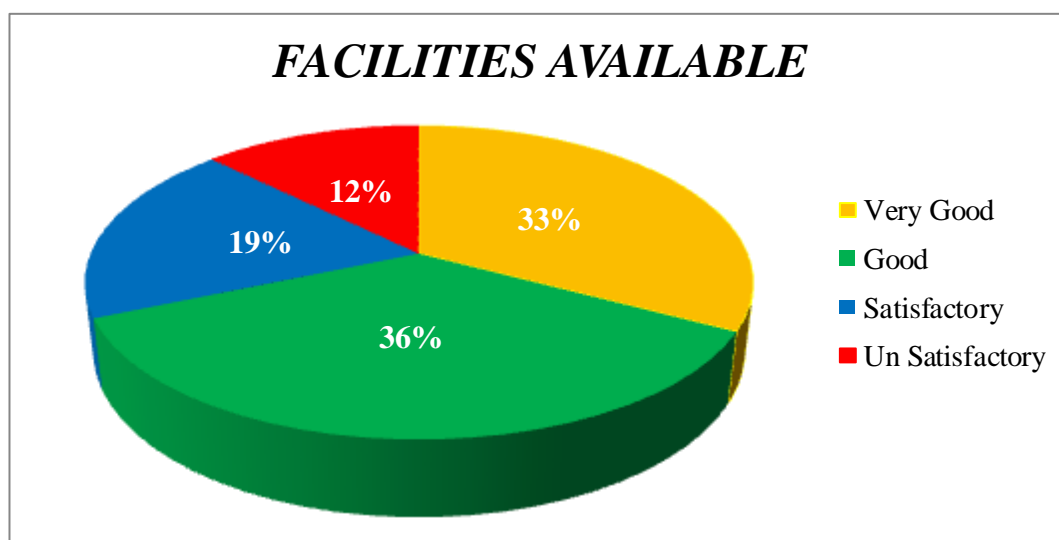
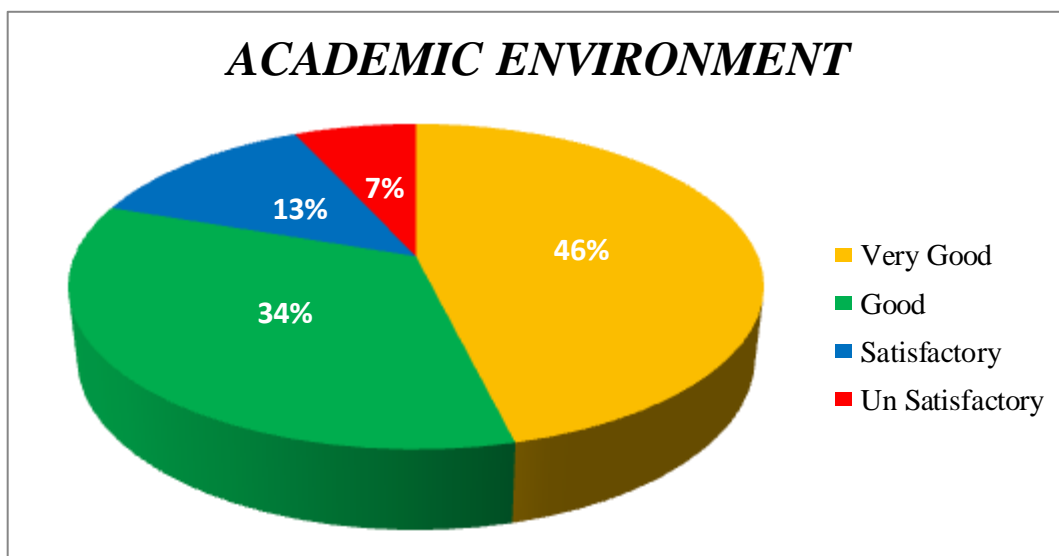

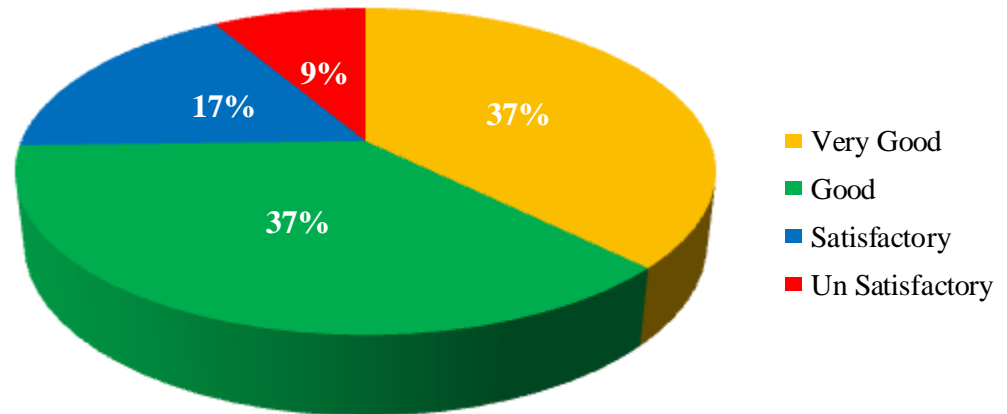

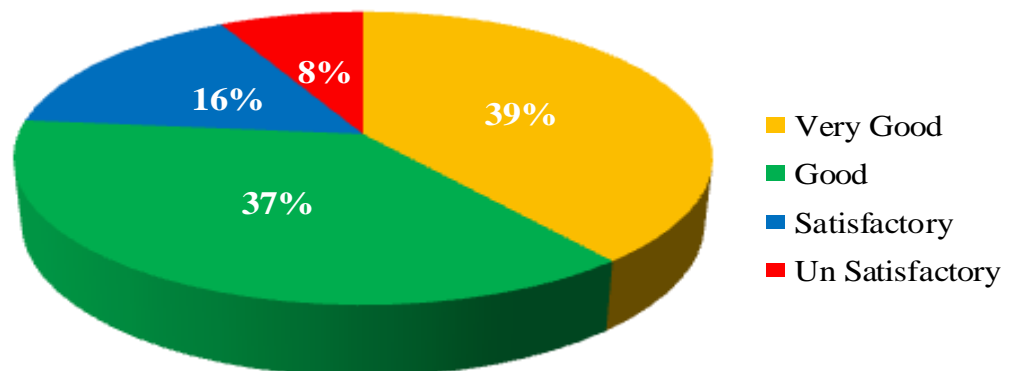
FEEDBACK OF UNDER GRADUATE STUDENTS
