- The Management encourages the faculty members to apply for UGC grants to pursue minor and major research projects.
- Teachers are encouraged by cash awards for publishing their Research Articles in the international journals.
- Department HODs are instructed to organize seminars / conferences / workshops / intercollegiate meets / guest lectures in different levels.
- These activities will provide good experience and exposure to the students community leading to good ambience in the respective departments and for their career development.
- Special lectures in the titles such as socio-economic changes, women's empowerment programme have been organised in main auditorium (Sathu Kalai Arangam) of the college to benefit more students.
- At the end of each academic year, campus interviews are conducted by the Placement Cell in association with IQAC. The name of the organisations which conducted the on campus placement drives are MPOWER YOUNG INDIA – Chennai, DURUVA FINANCE PVT LTD – Tamilnadu, ICICI BANK – Tamilnadu, BULL IT SERVICES – Sattur, ALCANCE TECHNOLOGIES – Chennai, L&W CONSTRUCTIONS – Bangalore and DHARMA TEX – Aruppukottai. 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

- Students select their NME courses and Diploma courses through on-line.
- In few Departments, students submit their assignments to the course teacher through on-line.
- Final year project with dissertation is mandatory for post graduate students.
- For UG entry level students, Communication Skill is imparted through the English Language Laboratory equipped with LCD Projectors, Computers and interactive CDs etc.
- Few Departments offer a skill based paper with 100% ICT.
- Students and Teachers access e-books and e-journals via DELNET and INFLIBNET.
- Provisions have been made in the time table for the seminar hour of students.
- 2-hour test on Saturdays and Peer teaching classes are conducted for students with arrear papers (RA), by senior students in Physics Department.
- Cluster College Programmes is being implemented in Maths, Physics, Chemistry, English, Computer Science, Zoology, and History Subjects. Department of Physics coordinates the cluster college meetings in Physics for the past **four** years.
- Dionysus, an Intra-collegiate students cultural fest, is conducted by the Department of English in each academic year. Overall champion ship prizes are issued to the winning departments.
- Literary forum was started to enrich student's English knowledge.
- Dr. M.S.K. Mohaideen, Psychologists, Life Clinic Foundation, Coimbatore visits periodically to our college and gives counselling to all the students to mould their character and to enhance their academic skills. Psychological counselling is given to some of the needy students. Some students visit him personally under the advice of HODs.
- For the past Two years Department of Chemistry is conducting Chemistry Curiosity Club (3C) activities. In this club, the department organise a minimum of two meetings in each semester and conduct several competitions for students of Chemistry department such as paper presentation, Chem-Quize, Chem-Connection, Chem-Drawing, Chem- Modeling and Chem-Speed and give away prizes to the winners.

- Sri Ramanujan Club is used to conduct many guest lectures and competitions for students on various occasions.
- Students of Maths Department visit mathematical labs in the nearby Arts & Science and Engineering Colleges.
- Four Hundred and Forty students of English Department enrolled for certificate course on “Vivekananda Education” and wrote the examination on 19.09.2016.
- The Literary exhibition “Art Fair” was organized by the Department of English on 30.09.2016.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) suggested by Tamilnadu State Council for Higher Education (TNSCHE) is being followed from 2008 onwards.
- Board of Studies (BOS) consists of the members from University (University Nominee), other colleges (Subject Experts), industrial experts and alumni.
- Students can opt for horizontal mobility in the UG level.
- Project work is mandatory for PG students.
- Non-Major Elective (NME) courses pave the way to the students to choose interdisciplinary papers.
- The Syllabus for all departments is reviewed and new regulation is implemented once in three years.
- The syllabus of new regulation is framed by considering the syllabus of neighbouring Universities, autonomous colleges and based on the local needs.
- In addition, introduction / deletion of any new course is also permitted if it is warranted.
- All faculty members are involved in framing the syllabi and participate in the Board of Studies Meeting. All suggestions, revision / incorporation of new titles and papers are seriously taken into consideration in drafting the final syllabi for new regulation.
- Consideration is given to the feedback of course teachers and students.
- Feedback from the subject experts, University nominees, Alumni and students are taken into consideration.
- Syllabus ratification is obtained through Academic Council which will be held every year.
- The Academic Council members are appointed by the affiliated University only. Their suggestions, advises and comments during the meeting are taken into consideration for ratification of the final syllabi of all Departments.

### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- New LCD projector units have been installed in four departments.
- The academic year calendar is issued to all in time which helps the stake holders to plan their academic activity.
- Conducting unit tests, quizzes, assignments, group discussion classes, seminars by students etc.
- Students are encouraged to submit their assignment through on-line.
- Motivating students for research activities through Conference / Workshop / Seminar / Guest Lecture etc.
- Teacher's study materials [Soft copy-PPT slides/PDF presentation] and lecture notes are shared with students.
- By involving all first year students to attend computer literacy and communication skill classes through empowerment programme.



### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- All components in any programme of study are evaluated continuously through internal evaluation and an external evaluation. Internal evaluation is done throughout the semester/year in the form of three CIA examinations, quizzes and assignments. External evaluation is done at the end of semester / year in the form of summative examination.
- The summative examination question papers are set by the external experts from other colleges or Universities. They prepare the scheme of evaluation, giving guidelines for the examiners for distribution of marks in the question. In case of numerical problems, solution of the problems with distribution of marks for different stages should be given in scheme of valuation to award marks.
- For each paper, the PG students must give three compulsory seminars. Best two marks will be taken for CIA mark calculation.
- M.Phil. scholars must undergo open viva-voce examination with external examiner.
- Evaluation of answer scripts will be done by the course teacher and external examiner from other colleges and universities.
- Publishing the examination results on the internet through the college website.
- Students are also permitted to apply for revaluation after the publication of results within a stipulated period.
- After revaluation, records are updated with changes if any and the student will be issued a revised memorandum of marks. If there are no changes, the student shall be intimated the same through a letter or a notice.
- Based on the credits and marks obtained by the student, the Grade Point Average (GPA) will be calculated for semester/year and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be calculated for entire program. Award of class will be finalized based on CGPA.
- Before the publication of summative examination results, the performance of the students is analyzed in the Awards Committee Meeting consisting of two University Nominees.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Cluster college programmes of various departments are beneficial for conducting student and teacher based activities such as quiz, seminar, paper presentation and guest lecture.

- Visit to historically important places like Jain cave temple at Othakadai, Chittanavasal and Palace at Tanjore etc.
- P.G students visit Aavin Milk Depot, Madurai.

- For the past SIX years Department of Chemistry is organising successively and successfully the DST sponsored INSPIRE Programme for the meritorious +1 students. It helps them to choose their career in the field of basic science. This year it was conducted between 04.10.2016 and 08.10.2016. In this programme, nearly 20 professors from various Universities and colleges gave lectures. 150 students from Virudhunagar, Ramnad, Tutucorin, Sivagangai and Madurai Districts participated and benefited.
- Dr.M.S.K.Mohaideen, a reputed Psychologist, Life Clinic Foundation, Coimbatore gives class wise General Psychological counselling for the entire students of the college periodically.
- The college offers the value added Diploma and Certificate courses.
- As per the moto of the college, “Quality Education with Humane Touch”, the college offers minimum fee structure for SF courses.
- The dividing system in the women’s hostel ensures the monthly mess bill of around Rs.1500/-.
- Presently Nineteen students belonging to visually and physically challenged categories are undergoing studies in the college.
- 101 students belonging to the nearby Government Arts and Science College performed their ancillary Physics practical classes and external practical examinations with the coaching of our teachers.
- Organization of seminar / workshops / guest lecture by most of the departments.
- Departments arrange for industrial visits, spot studies, educational tours and heritage tours for students.
- Involving the students on more number of social service activities to make them as responsible citizens.

- Orientation programme for Regular and SF students on the first day, they enter into the college.
- Mentor care and counselling system for each student.
- Sharing the knowledge resource by alumni and their financial assistance to the needy.
- More number of research publications in the International and National journals.
- Frequent participation of teachers in the academic activities held in the Universities and other institutions, to upgrade their knowledge.
- Eighth volume of Multidisciplinary Research Journal ‘Devanga Arts College Manas’, a peer reviewed, annual journal is published. Teachers of Devanga Arts College and other colleges publish their research articles in it.
- Well organized CIA Tests and semester examination with Double Valuation system.
- Participation of more girl students in the sports activities in the University, state and zonal level competitions.

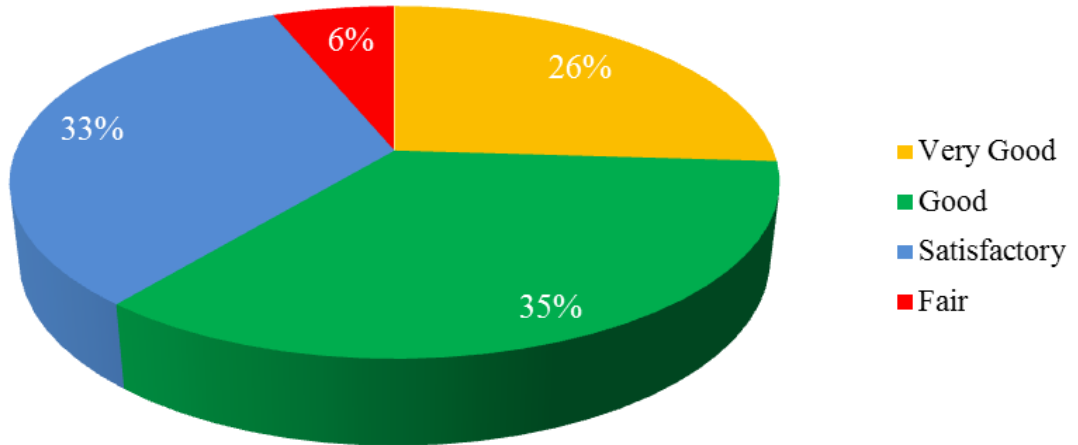

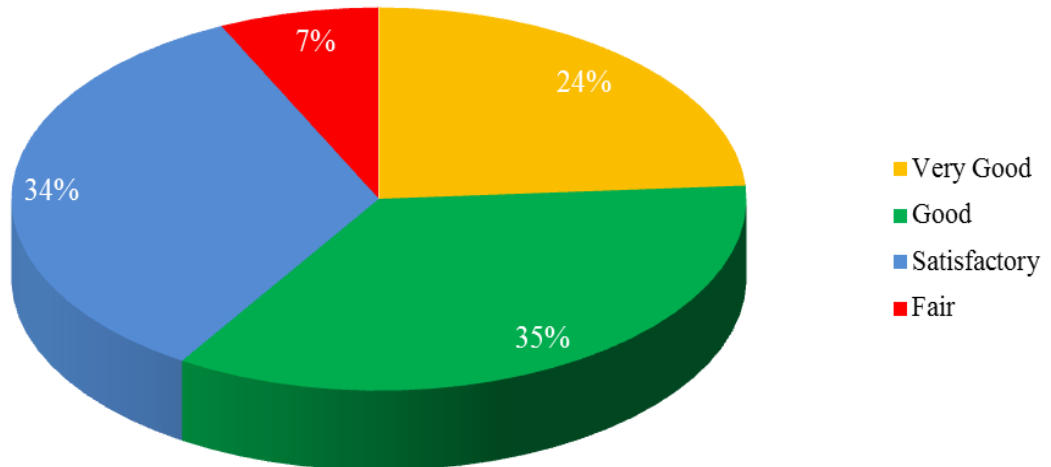
**FEEDBACK ANALYSIS OF UNDER GRADUATE STUDENTS**

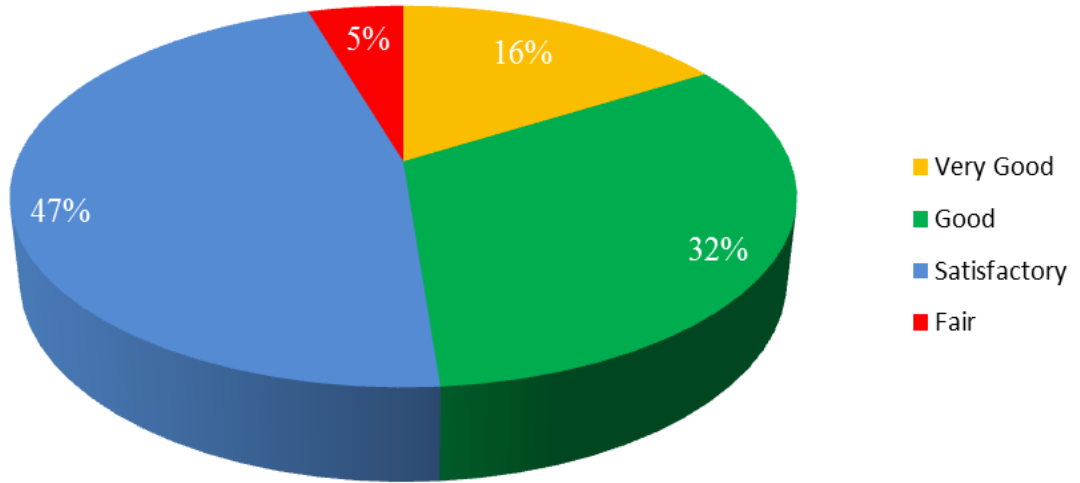

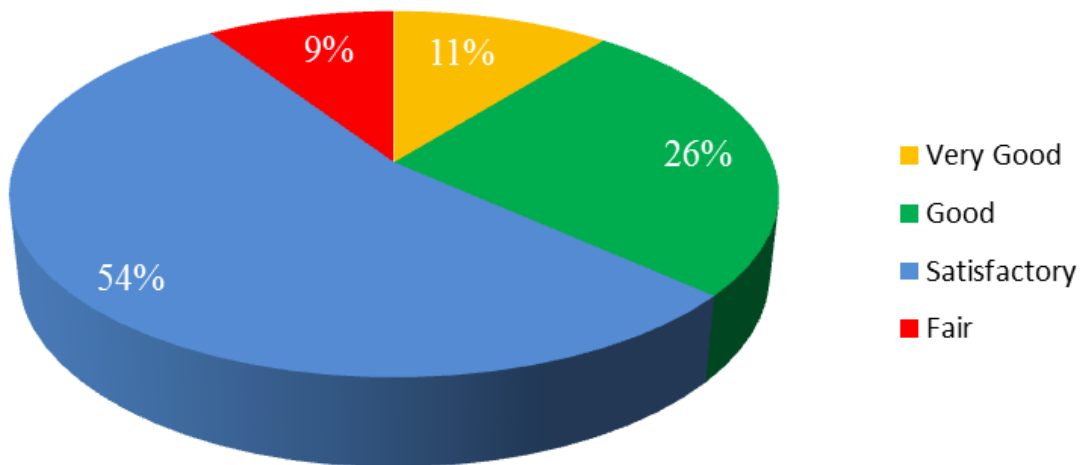


**FEEDBACK ANALYSIS OF POST GRADUATE STUDENTS**

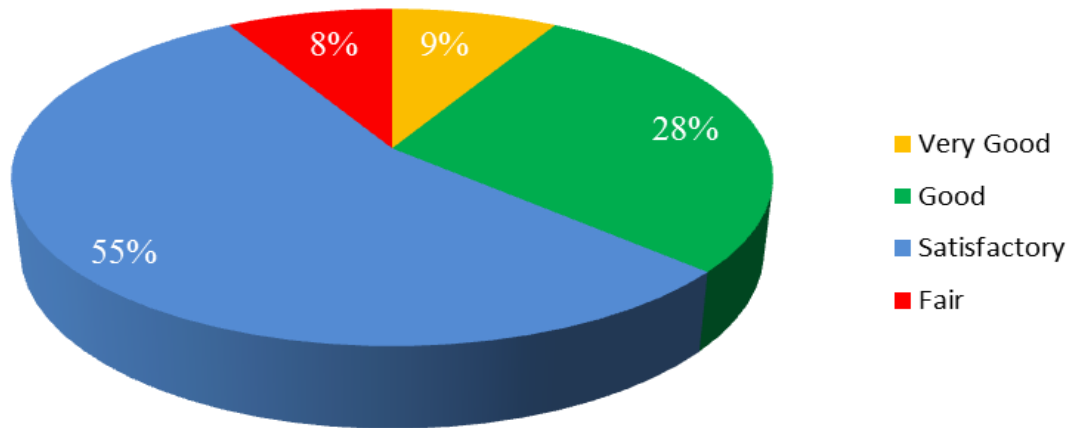
